What Makes a Strong Project?

- Addresses a real, current need
- Demonstrates leadership and organization
- Involves planning and volunteer coordination
- Creates sustainable or high-impact outcomes
- Respects the dignity of families served

Examples of Potential Projects

- Large-scale donation drives for household essentials
- Designing/building storage improvements for the Sharehouse
- Community hygiene kit or school supply drives
- Organizing volunteer teams to sort and inventory donations
- Facility improvements that increase efficiency and accessibility

Important Steps

Before beginning your proposal process, you are required to contact our Sharehouse Manager to schedule an appointment and review current project needs. Develop a clear plan outlining leadership, volunteers, materials, timeline, and budget. Obtain Scout approval and maintain communication throughout the project.
